## **Programs:**

- **Engineering Transfer**

This program prepares pre-engineering students for transfer to a four-year institution with junior standing.

The Engineering Transfer program classes are the only classes at two-year colleges in the Seattle area that are offered in the evenings and in hybrid format.

- **Math Education  
DTA/MRP**

This degree program is designed to meet the minimum general education requirements to prepare students for teacher certification in secondary math at Central Washington University, Eastern Washington, Western Washington University, and Washington State University. This agreement meets all the requirements of Washington's Direct Transfer Agreement.

- **Center for Architecture,  
Design & Engineering:**

Within the School of Engineering, Science & Math, students can earn degrees and certificates in design technology in specialty areas including mechanical, civil, and architecture. The Architectural Technology AAS-T degree transfers to Washington State University's Bachelor's of Architectural Studies and Master of Architecture.
